Between 9th and 15th October, it is County Lines Intensification Week in relation to national week of action to tackle and educate in relation to County Line Drug Dealing. As you are aware or may not, county lines were given to the form of organised crimes in which drug dealers from larger cities exploit vulnerable people, including children and force them to deal drugs in smaller towns and cities. It takes its name from the mobile phone lines used by dealers to communicate between towns and advertise their drugs for sale. During the week the Safer Neighbourhood Team will be doing some engagements around the topic and giving you useful advice on how to report drug dealing in your communities.

On Saturday 9th September officers from SNT were at Force HQ for the annual Derbyshire Community Speed Watch scheme conference which looks to provide information and support to volunteers who give their time make communities safer by taking part in Community Speed Watch Checks. During the conference we took the time to engage with the Police and Crime Commissioner and speak to HQ staff who run the scheme and a number of volunteers from Community Speed Watch group across the county.



18th September brought Day 1 of the National Rural Crime Week of Action and SNT worked with the Rural Crime Team and partners at Bakewell Livestock Market to give an opportunity for members of the public to speak to us and their concerns.
